

MINISTER'S LETTER

Traditionally, the 40 days of Lent have been a time when Christians fasted, spent time in prayer, studied the Bible or other spiritual books, didn't eat meat, and examined their consciences with a view to coming closer to God, or perhaps it would be truer to say 'letting God come closer to them'. But nowadays people give up chocolate, or alcohol, or take up some exercise programme, the aim being, I suppose, to improve personal well-being, or just lose weight.

How about going back to the 'old ways' this Lent? Could we risk engaging in one of the old traditions? Could we plan, and commit, to a prayer time, or a Bible reading time (accompanied by some helpful notes which anyone in the Ministry Team could get for you), or follow the Diocese's 'Come and See' programme. What does that last involve? Here's what the Diocese says:

"We send you a short email each day, Monday to Saturday. And on Sundays during Lent you receive a short video from Bishop Steven exploring the theme for Come and See that year in a bit more detail. Each email begins with a short passage of text from the Bible. If you've never opened a Bible before, please don't worry, just go with the flow as you settle in to the journey.


There is a separate weekly email for children and families, and separate materials for teachers, and children, youth and family leaders too. Children and schools materials include films from our school chaplains, and access to some of the contemplative practices from our Space Makers toolkit."

All you need to do is go onto the website: https://www.oxford.anglican.org/come-and-see/ and register.

If, however, you would rather do some activity together with other people, you might like to join me in the current 'Big Church Read' which is a novel <u>Lydia</u> by Paula Gooder [Canon Chancellor at St Paul's Cathedral, London, and New Testament scholar]. You can find out about the Big Church Read on https://thebigchurchread.co.uk But here's what they say about <u>Lydia.</u>

"Journey with Paula Gooder as she tells Lydia's story – who she was, the life she lived and her first-century faith – and in doing so opens up Paul's letter to the Philippians, giving a sense of the cultural and historical pressures that shaped Paul's thinking, and the faith of the early church.

Written in the gripping style of Gerd Theissen's <u>The Shadow of the Galilean</u>, and similarly rigorously researched, this is a book for everyone and anyone who wants to engage more deeply and imaginatively with Paul's theology – from one of the UK's foremost New Testament scholars."



We would meet in a group to do this. Perhaps on a weekday evening, but dates and venue to be discussed. Unfortunately, the book is not in paperback until October. It can be bought for £12-99, or even cheaper if one searches for second hand copies. If you would like to be part of a group reading and discussing Lydia get in touch with me **as soon as possible**, so I can see who is interested and we can plan dates and a venue.

We are also offering a series of Lent lectures which will be on four Thursday evenings in Lent starting on Thursday 2nd March. See page 9 for more information. We will have the details of the speakers in next month's magazine but perhaps you might like to put the dates in your calendar now. Those that have come along to the Lent Lectures previously will know that they have been really interesting and inspirational, and the opportunity to meet and chat with others over supper beforehand is always very good too!

NEWS FROM WULU

Christmas wishes

Bishop Zechariah sent us best wishes for Christmas from himself and the church communities in Wulu.

Martin Ngula Simon

I asked Martin Ngula Simon, recently appointed development officer for Wulu Diocese, to tell us something about himself. He wrote:

I am South Sudanese by nationality. I hold a Diploma in Social Science awarded by the Department of Public Administration in 2014.

I work for different institutions in the government at State level and I also serve different NGOs in different capacities.

I accepted the work with Bishop Zechariah without any reservations as I would like to help him achieve the development of our Diocese. I ask God to God to guide me so that when I move on from this position to other assignments I am able to leave something small in the Diocese in regards to development.

The following are my roles as Diocesan Development Officer:

- 1. Promote pioneering ministry in the parishes and church communities and be available as a point of contact to the diocese
- 2. Plan and develop a regular program to introduce the principal of pioneering ministry. This includes writing a proposal.
- 3. Enable lay pioneer ministry to thrive and grow.
- 4. Change life for the better and grow the spiritual heart of our church

We will encourage and support our parishes and church school as we aim to:

- 1. Make disciples of Christ
- 2. Grow our church
- 3. Equip people for lifelong learning and promote the transformation of our society.

Sanitary pads

We have received a report outlining the successful distribution of sanitary kits, including sanitary pads and two bars of soap, to 30 adolescent girls at the Girls Primary School in Wulu using money we have donated. There is a need to distribute kits to more girls, but a poor exchange rate of US dollars to South Sudanese pounds, combined with inflation in South Sudan, meant this was all that could be afforded. None the less, the school is very grateful for our contribution.



They would like to be able to distribute new packs to girls that need them each term, and also would like to be able to put up fencing around the school to stop people just randomly walking into the school premises, but Bishop Zechariah has asked if our donations can go towards maintaining the teachers' incentive programme.

Most recent donation

We sent the equivalent of 600 USD (349,447.43 South Sudanese Pounds) to Bishop Zechariah in early January. The school have recruited two more teachers starting this January, so our donation should enable Bishop Zechariah to continue to give each teacher 10,000 SSP every month for the next five months.

As always, thank you for your continued support.

Lent 2023

In the first 300-400 years of Christianity, many faithful women and men recognized the fruitfulness of setting aside chunks of time surrounding major Christian holidays. Christians from Jewish and Gentile roots adapted this practice from the rhythms of festivals that God laid out in the Old Testament. Followers of Jesus began to contextualize this in order to help themselves fully prepare for and then enter into the most important annual celebrations like Christmas and Easter.

Lent was set aside as a time for Christians to contemplate Jesus' work on the cross in preparation for a massive celebration on Easter. People would fast as an act of recognition of their sin and also as a means of preparing for the Spirit to have more access to work in their lives.

The same opportunity is available to us today during Lent. It's a time to reflect on our sinful nature and our fragile humanity so that when Easter comes we are able to more fully appreciate and celebrate Jesus' victory over sin and death on the cross.' 

Our 2023 programme began on 10th January with an illustrated talk from Terry Winters. This meeting was via Zoom. About 18 members logged in for this fascinating 'journey' through the development of the garden at Ordnance House.

After years of working in the hectic world of advertising, Terry decided to devote his time to developing this wonderful garden. He was inspired by Dan Pearson's design programmes and other looking at existing gardens.

Ordnance House Garden was non-existent when he and his wife moved there. Since then, he has changed the "blank canvas" into interconnecting gardens and vistas. A series of excellent photos showed us these gardens highlighting some of the outstanding planting including topiary lollipops of Privet, Viburnum and Portuguese Laurel, Alliums and Lavender (in shades of white, blue and purple), Oriental poppies and Clematis to name but a few!

He won an RHS Gold Medal for the best Back Garden in the "My Chelsea Garden' competition and last year was seen in Episode 15 of Gardeners World.

SHELSWELL POETRY APPRECIATION GROUP

At our January meeting, on the 17th, we read the following poems – all on the subject of Flowers, both actual and metaphorical.

In *Tulips, Sylvia Plath*, lying in hospital, feels watched and oppressed by the flowers' vitality, whereas *EJ Scovell* admires tulips even as they decay and *Ella Wheeler Wilcox* celebrates colour and scent in *Red Carnations*.

The Sick Rose by William Blake, One Perfect Rose by Dorothy Parker and To the Virgins to Make Much of Time by Robert Herrick all use roses as symbols. Both Anne Sexton in Red Roses and Fred D.Aguiar in A Gift of a Rose use them to symbolise terrible violence.

A song from *Gilbert and Sullivan's The Mikado, The Flowers that Bloom in the Spring,* is light-hearted, but the Scottish song lyrics **The Flowers of the Forest** is a heart-wrenching lament for the young men slain at The Battle of Flodden.

Wintry flora is represented by the old carol *The Holly and the Ivy, The Christmas Life by Wendy Cope, Holly by A R Ammons, Brother Ivy by Denise Levertov* and *To the Ivy by John Clare*. A flower which spans late winter and early spring is the snowdrop, praised by William Wordsworth in *To A Snowdrop*.

A flower which can be found in flower even in the hardest winter is gorse, and *Chris Orsman* writes about its combination of beauty and ugliness.

In *The Last Chrysanthemum, Thomas Hardy* finds the flower to be an anomaly blooming so late in the year, and *Mark Van Doren*, in *After Long Drought*, writes of the changing of the seasons.

Leaving Early by Sylvia Plath makes flowers in vases the witnesses to a thwarted love affair.

Two poems about poppies – *Big Poppy by Ted Hughes and Sonnet to the Poppy by Anna Seward* personify the flowers as young women, no better than they ought to be.

Other poems for discussion were *Amaryllis -Pride*, an anonymous piece and *The Flower by Alfred Lord Tennyson*.
